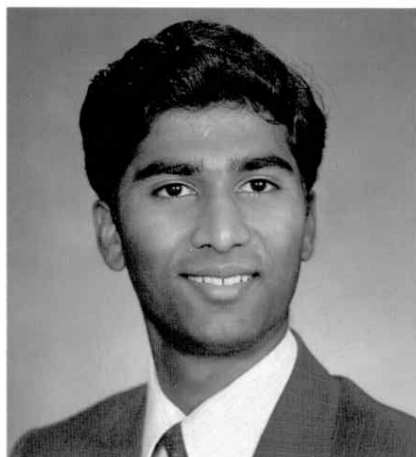


... AND LOOK AT THEM NOW!

Shiva Ayyadurai
